
The Vice Presidents will be welcoming new members and visitors on arrival at meeting. If you see a new person, please make them feel welcome.



In transit, where bus travel is involved, there is more than one tap on point in most buses. Forming a single line at the driver tap point does cause delays when we have large numbers. We also will trial faster lead groups going directly to lunch venues when the group is strung out over a long distance on longer walks.


