We will then enjoy an hour and half cruise around the beautiful Brisbane Waters.

Morning tea will be served on the ferry.

We arrive at DAVISTOWN 11.45 and adjourn to the RSL for lunch.

The full cost will be \$35.00 payable at the January meeting.

Feb 20 2020, Rookwood Cemetery Tour.

On this tour we will learn about the fascinating history of Rookwood. We will have a guided tour. Coach leaves from Hornsby 9.00 am.

Morning tea at the Rookwood Cafe at your own expense.

Following the tour we will have lunch at Dooleys at Lidcombe, again at your own expense.

Arrive back at Hornsby by 4 ppm.

Cost \$30 pp. Pay at the Jan or Feb meeting.

Armidale-Moree Tour - March 2020

The schedule for our trip to Armidale and Moree in March 2020 is as follows:

Fri 13 March: Travel by train from Hornsby to Armidale. Dep Hornsby 10.03 am, Arr. Armidale 5.35 pm. A coach will take us to our motel.

Sat 14: In the morning we will have a familiarisation coach tour of Armidale. In the afternoon we will visit and have a guided tour of Saumarez House which is a historic property just out of Armidale.

Sun 15: Today we will head out on the Waterfall Way and see some of the spectacular scenery and waterfalls. At Dorrigo we will visit the National Park and walk among the tree tops. We will drive past and view the Dorrigo railway museum (Not open to the public)

Mon 16: Today we will visit the Armidale Art Gallery and the New England University which has several interesting museums. There may be some time for retail therapy.

Tue 17: Today we will be travelling from Armidale to Moree. A little way north of Armidale we will be visiting a sheep property. This will be a unique opportunity to see a real sheep property in operation. This visit has been arranged by one of our members. We will have two nights in Moree.

Wed 18: Moree is famous for its heated artesian spa baths with their reputed health benefits. Our motel has its own spa bath so you can indulge yourself. We will be having guided tours of a cotton plantation and a Pecan nut orchard.

Thu 19: Travel by train from Moree to Hornsby, Dep Moree 8.05 am, Arr Hornsby 4.03 pm.

Here are the details of what is included and what will be at your expense.

- 1: You will have to make and pay for your own train booking (more details below)
- 2: In Armidale accommodation and evening meals are included. Breakfasts will be at your expense at the café next door. Lunches not included.
- 3: In Moree the motel provides dinner, bed and breakfast. Lunches not included.
- 4: Any meals on the train are at your expense,
- 5: All admission fees are included.

You can make your train booking on the internet (www.transportnsw.info) and follow the various options. Those on a Centerlink pension travel for free on economy class however there is a small fee for first class. If you have a Senior's Card you travel for half fare. If you are not able to do the booking on the internet you can do it by phone (132232 between 7am and 10pm and have your concession card details handy). Another option is to make your reservation at the Booking Office at Central Station.

It is recommended that you make your train booking as soon as possible.

The cost of the trip is \$890 per person twin share and the single supplement is \$344.

This has to be paid in full at the Feb 2020 meeting at the latest.

BUSHFIRE EVACUATION PLAN


Discuss your evacuation plan with all members of your household and make your decisions long before they're needed


WHAT TO PACK:

BASICS – Keys, change of clothes, spare shoes, sleeping bag, water HYGIENE – Toothbrush, underwear, wet wipes, sanitary items HEALTH – any medicines, prescriptions, allergy specific foods you need IDENTIFICATION – Birth certificate, passport and drivers licence DOCUMENTATION - Proof of insurance, marriage certificate, will, property deeds PETS – Supplies for your animals like food, leash, kitty litter etc ELECTRONICS – Phone, phone charger, laptop, external hard drive IRREPLACEABLES – Photos, jewellery, sentimental items, family heirlooms CASH – any cash, credit and or debit cards EMERGENCY KIT – First aid, torch, batteries, emergency contact numbers.

These items should be packed and ready to go well in advance of any bushfire emergency.
