



Despite a long history of health problems the eulogies shared the common theme of determination especially in bringing-up daughter Susie who club members might recall passed away from pancreatic cancer some three years ago. Helen endured her problems in a most positive and accepting manner.

One who enjoyed dinner parties and afternoon lunches, Helen's capacity as a hostess is legendary. Rev Brian Heath stressed chosen bible readings highlighted Helen's commitment to inclusivity and in welcoming dinner guests to her table. David highlighted his role in acting in working as directed.

She was very active in St Swithun's Parish at Pymble and St John's Asquith and a large number of mourners attended from both parishes, including the past Pastor of St Swithun's, Dr Roger Chilton. Dr Chilton was a close family friend for many years.

Although she was brought up in a time when young females were encouraged to leave school and pursue a secretarial role in life she later in life gained adult matriculation to University and completed an Arts degree. This she used in a career in education especially in private schools.

Helen's last days were spent in Neringah private hospital where Helen showed determination to gain release for Christmas. She passed away on Tuesday 18 December.

Sights and sounds or smells can trigger this déjà vu from deep within.


It could be something from my childhood that stirs this echo in my heart.
