

Well done to Barbara and her team.



## **Darlinghurst Gaol Report**

Twenty six members attended the booked tour to the old Darlinghurst Gaol. Arriving shortly after



10am Pam checked in and time was then available to visit the Hangout Café for a welcome coffee. We were later able to realise how aptly named this café in Forbes Street was named.

Our guide Deborah turned out to be a local having been educated at Asquith Girls High. She is also a lecturer at the current occupiers of the buildings – The National Art School.

The tour provided contrasts between original use, varied historical use and a vastly different present day occupancy. The site was a stockade to house convict

gangs from 1924 to 1841. It then became Darlinghurst Gaol. The public hangings near the front gate in Forbes street obviously influenced the naming of the cafe. In all 76 hangings took place at the Gaol.

We were treated to stories of inmates such as Henry Lawson, Captain Starlight and Captain Moonlight. Visits to the Cell block, various tunnels, the Governor's



residence and the chapel provided a moving description of the history of the gaol.

With the completion of Long Bay Complex the prisoners were moved in 1914 and in World War 1 the buildings were used as a detention Camp.

From 1922 – 2005 the buildings House the East Sydney Technical College. As the National Art School was separated from TAFE from 2005 this entity has been the sole occupant of the site.
