Goat Island Outing

"I just couldn't believe it!" That was a comment from one of the 33 AMPC Members who toured Goat Island on Thursday 15th August. Many did not know where Goat Island was, until our charted ferry from Circular Quay turned left under the Harbour Bridge. Goat Island is the first island we met, tucked between Balmain to the South and Balls Head to the North. It is a small island that, like a number of Harbour islands, gets its name from its shape.

There is evidence of early Aboriginal occupation, and legend says that Bennelong and his wife Barangaroo relaxed there often. In the early 1830's, Governor Bourke ordered the construction of a Magazine on the island to store the colony's gunpowder. A squad of convicts, with a detachment of soldiers to guard them, were sent to the island to quarry beautiful sandstone blocks which were used to build the large Magazine and elegant soldier's quarters which still stand today. All explosives were finally removed from the island in 1900.

In 1835 the Colony's Water Police were relocated to the north end of the island and a water level ditch was cut across the island to separate the police from the convicts. Water Police continued



to operate from the island for many years. In the 1990's the island became the base for the TV series *Water Rats*. In 1901 the island was given to the Sydney Harbor Trust, and a magnificent residence was built for the Harbour Master, with views right down the Harbour to the East, and Darling Harbour to the South.

Much more could be written about boat building, social activities such as tennis and dances, rock concerts, etc., but suffice it to say that we all enjoyed an excellent tour, led by two very well informed National Parks guides.

AUGUST — Wayne Stevens, Berowra Station Officer, NSW Fire and Rescue kept members informed and amused as he responded to a Q and A session on bushfire safety. Some of the points raised:

- terminology is moving from using the word bushfire to wildfire
- it is recommended in a fire emergency that you leave and not stay; this cannot be enforced but others' lives may then also be placed at risk
- never re-enter a house once you leave
- the Fire Brigade will change batteries in your smoke alarm and check placement
- Stored Water Supply (SWS) if you live in a bush fire prone area and have a swimming pool or dam on your property, it is possible to register the fact.


