Dr Greg de Moore

The speaker at our February meeting Dr Greg de Moore kept us alternatively spellbound and laughing, with a few tears on the side. He told us about Australian, Dr John Cade, and his discovery of the healing power of lithium carbonate for patients with bi-polar disorder. We heard that the seeds of this work were observations he made as a prisoner of war in Changi. This was followed up after the war by further observations and experimentation, including using himself as a guinea pig. His long suffering wife even had her kitchen fridge filled with bottles of patient's urine. We think of lithium in terms of batteries, but the understanding of its use in bipolar disorder was the world's first breakthrough in psychiatric medication.






