ACTIVITIES JIM & JUDY THOMPSON

THURSDAY 15 APRIL 2021 CHAU CHAK WING MUSEUM, SYDNEY UNIVERSITY

This is a new museum at Sydney University which brings together collections from several of the museums that were in separate locations. These include the Nicholson, Macleay and the University art collection. We will have a guided tour. There is a café where we can have lunch. We will travel to Central by train and catch a bus to the University.

Dep Berowra 8.53am, Hornsby 9.04am Interurban train.

Cost of tour is \$10 pp. Please pay by EFT or by cash at the April meeting.

SUNDAY 16 TO FRIDAY 21 MAY 2021 – YAMBA

Departing Hornsby at 7.47am we will travel by train to Grafton and then by coach to our motel at Yamba, arriving at 6.20pm. Return travel is also by coach and train, arriving at Hornsby at 7.38pm.

The detailed daily programme was in the March issue of the Bulletin.

The cost is \$1100 pp. Single supplement is \$250 pp.

A deposit of \$100 pp should have been paid by 11 March 2021 and the balance of \$1000 is to be paid by 29 April 2021.

You will need to make your own rail reservations from Hornsby to Yamba and return. These can be made on the internet at transportnsw.info or at Central Station. You will need to have details of your concession cards available.

Each person must fill out a personal particulars form. These will be placed in a sealed envelope and returned at the end of the trip. Each person must also fill out a Dietary Form. There may be a surcharge for special diets. Details are on the Dietary Form.

THURSDAY 17 JUNE 2021 – PRINCE HENRY HOSPITAL NURSING AND MEDICAL MUSEUM

This is a museum celebrating the history of one of Sydney's oldest hospitals. Prince Henry was a general hospital which also treated infectious diseases. The museum shows the advancements in nursing care from World War I when Sydney underwent the Spanish Flu Pandemic, through World War II to the 1970s. We will have a guided tour and the cost is \$13 pp. A couple of cafes are nearby for lunch. We will travel to Central by train and catch a bus to the Museum.

HARS Aviation Museu

On Thursday, 18th March, 20 intrepid Probus Trippers enjoyed a visit to the Historical Aircraft Restoration Society (HARS) Aviation Museum at Albion Park. The weather was lovely and our guides were excellent...

We saw a wide range of historical aircraft, both commercial and military, from a Tiger Moth biplane of the 1930's to a swing-wing F111 fighter-bomber of our modern era. There was a Catalina, which could land on both water and land, and which played an important role in the Pacific campaign of WW2, and a Caribou Transport, which was highly valued in the Vietnam War. There were several DC-3's, including one, in which one of our number had flown as Hostess with TAA, and another, still being restored, in which Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip had flown during their visit to Australia.

Probably the most outstanding exhibit was the Lockheed Super Constellation. This had been lovingly rescued from the aeroplane "graveyard" in the US, where it was the only one that had not been "cannibalised" for parts. The only reason was that a window had been left open, and many pigeons over the years had left a deposit! A photo on the Airport Stairs alongside this aircraft showed the Beetles using these stairs on their visit to Sydney. A number of the aircraft are still flying, and some will feature in the RAAF Centenary Flyover of Canberra on 31st March.

We were only able to view from the outside the QANTAS 747, "City of Canberra" that made the first non-stop flight from London to Sydney in 1989. The inside was occupied by a film crew working on the George Miller movie "Three Thousand Years of Longing," that is being produced in Sydney at present. Nevertheless, a great day, and great memories.





DINE & DISCOVER NSW VOUCHERS

From today, if you haven't already, you can apply for your Dine & Discover NSW vouchers. You can apply online in a few simple steps or you can visit a Service NSW office.

Every NSW resident 18 and over can apply to receive:

- 2 x \$25 vouchers for eating in at restaurants, cafes, bars, wineries, pubs and clubs (not redeemable for alcohol).
- 2 x \$25 vouchers for entertainment and recreation, including live music, recreational activities, cinemas and arts venues.

Vouchers can be used 7 days a week, excluding public holidays.

Each voucher can only be used once. If you don't spend the full \$25, the remaining balance cannot be used.

You can find participating businesses in your area on the Service NSW app or go to the <u>Dine</u> & Discover NSW business finder.

HOW IT WORKS

Dine & Discover NSW will roll out across the state during March and April.

Your vouchers can be used across NSW and are **valid until Wednesday 30 June.** By applying today, you'll have plenty of time to enjoy the best of NSW.

HOW TO APPLY

Visit Service NSW.gov.au website and go to MyServiceNSW Account. If you do not already have an account you can create one. Or you can visit your local ServiceNSW office in person and the staff will help you. You will need 2 forms of ID to obtain your vouchers, ie. Driver's licence and Medicare card. Vouchers will be sent to your mobile phone.
