COMMITTEE NOTES – MARCH 2024

- 1. The major concern of the new Committee is the difficult result that has been left us by the Annual General Meeting. Fortunately, under Section 4.d of the Constitution, the Committee was able to appoint Trish Taylor to the vacant Tours/Excursions position. However, that still leaves unfilled the Committee positions for Vice President Elect (for next year's President), Hospitality and Walks Rep. These are important roles, and the life of our Club will be diminished if they are not filled.
- 2. The most serious vacancy is the position of Secretary. The Probus Club Handbook states that "Each Club is required by its constitution to have a Secretary." The definition of the role of the Secretary, begins with the statement "The role of the Secretary is vital to the Club."
- 3. John Davies has made the following statement: "My present position is that I offered at the AGM to be Acting Secretary for a short time, to get the Club moving forward. But, as I have commitments in several other organisations, and have several health issues, I cannot continue for more than another month or two. However, as Assistant Secretary I can help anyone who offers to take on the role of Secretary."
- 4. The new Committee considered this at length, and agreed that it is a crucial issue. A motion was moved that "If no Secretary could be found by the next Meeting, a motion would be moved to close the Club."
- 5. There was a complaint that some people at the AGM felt they were being "bullied" over this issue, but members of the Committee have been quietly approaching potential Secretaries for months, without any success. We have now reached the point where we are desperate for someone to put up their hand. And we are willing to help that person wherever help is needed.
- 6. We now have a membership of 140, but there are some who have not yet paid. Payment must be made by the next meeting, as that is when our per capita fees are paid to Probus Headquarters.
