This will be a great opportunity to enjoy the magnificent Hawkesbury River while the mail is delivered to isolated settlements along the river.







AUTHORS.

Many of us will remember the 'Jack Irish' series

on TV, about the less than upstanding lawyer who, based in Melbourne, could not stay out of trouble. Unlike a lot of TV programs, this series was adapted from novels written by an author, in this case - Peter Temple, with his novels being printed in over 20 countries. For his novel *The Broken Shore*, he won the world's most prestigious prize for crime writing - the Crime Writers Association Gold Dagger, in 2007 - the first Australian to do so. He won the Miles Franklin Award for his novel '*Truth'*. Perhaps the finest *noir* style crime writer Australia has seen. Peter Temple was married to Anita, with one son Nicholas, and died aged 71 in Ballarat in Victoria, in 2018.
