January 18th Summer Lunch on the Waterfront at the Newport Hotel

We will enjoy good company, fabulous views & good food at the upgraded Newport Hotel. We have booked the shaded "Tree Area" for lunch & Spray Misters have been installed around the venue. Travel will be by public transport or drive yourself.

- You must sign up at the Jan meeting, to be sure of the reservation numbers.
- The Newport, 2 Kalinya Street, Newport.
- Order & pay for your meals & drinks on the day. No prepayment.
 Prices from about \$20 to \$35+
- If driving, please arrive about 11:30 to get good undercover parking at the Hotel. There is limited public parking on the streets. People with limited mobility can be dropped off at the carpark ramp leading to our reserved garden area.
- The 199 Bus or L90 Bus stop at the Hotel's front door. Catch this bus from Pittwater Road or Barrenjoey Road
- If you want to go by public transport:
 - o **9:42am** Train from Hornsby to Gordon
 - 10:15am 197 Bus Gordon station Bus Stop A to Pittwater Place Shopping centre Mona Vale (1 bus per hour). Walk 100 meters to Barrenjoey Road
 - 199 Bus from B-Line stop 210323 in Barrenjoey Road to the Newport Hotel (frequent service)
- Heat Cancellation Policy. As this is an outdoor venue, in case of extreme heat I will cancel the booking, in line with club policy. If the forecast is 36°C or hotter for Sydney, I will cancel the booking on the previous day. You can still attend if you wish, but there will be no group booking.



We will enjoy a 3-hour *Sydney Tall Ships* cruise that includes a glass of bubbly, lovely lunch, a chance to explore Goat island with a guide as well as sailing past the stately homes of Sydney Harbour.
