Hyde Park Barracks is a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site in the heart of Sydney. Originally built to house convicts, the Barracks has also served as an immigration depot, asylum, law courts and government offices.

Discover the stories of Hyde Park Barracks through a self-guided immersive experience, using interactive audio technology. Hear the stories of male convicts, immigrants and women in need, as well as the Aboriginal nations that were impacted by colonial Australia. Duration: 1-1.5 hours.

Catch the 9.42 a.m. train from Hornsby platform 1, arriving at Town Hall Station at 10.27 a.m. Then it's an 11 minute walk via Park Street and Hyde Park to the Barracks.

TRIP TO COCKATOO ISLAND

After a short ferry ride from Barangaroo we arrived at Cockatoo Island where we had a conducted tour. Cockatoo Island is a very historic site. It was first used to house convicts in 1837. Many of the sandstone buildings built by the convicts have been well preserved. The graving dock was built by convicts and it played an important role in supporting naval operations. From 1857 to 1992 the Island was a major shipbuilding and repair facility. The RAN's six Oberon class submarines were refitted on the Island. Our guide was very informative and we all learnt a lot about about the history of the Island". Regards
