

THURSDAY 18 MARCH 2021. HARS AVIATION MUSEUM

We will catch the 8.35am Interurban train from Hornsby (Platform 3), Berowra 8.24am and Asquith 8.32am. At Central (Platform 25), we will catch the 9.29am train to Albion Park Rail.

We will have a guided tour of the aircraft in this museum which includes an ex-QANTAS 747.

Morning tea, lunch and the tour are included in the price. Total cost \$32.00.

There is a level walk of 400m from the station to the museum.

It will be necessary to select your lunch from this list:

- A. Homemade pie with mashed potato and peas.
- B. Individual mixed sandwich plate.
- C. Quiche and salad
- D. Crumbed chicken strips and salad.
- E. Homemade soup served with bread roll.

This trip was originally scheduled for April 2020 but was cancelled due to COVID.

THURSDAY 15 APRIL 2021 CHAU CHAK WING MUSEUM, SYDNEY UNIVERSITY

This is a new museum at Sydney University which brings together collections from several of the museums that were in separate locations. These include the Nicholson, Macleay and the University art collection. We will have a guided tour. There is a café where we can have lunch. We will travel to Central by train and catch a bus to the University.

SUNDAY 16 TO FRIDAY 21 MAY 2021 – YAMBA

Departing Hornsby at 7.47am we will travel by train to Grafton and then by coach to our motel at Yamba, arriving at 6.20pm. Return travel is also by coach and train, arriving at Hornsby at 7.38pm.

The detailed daily programme is in this issue of the Bulletin.

The cost is \$1100 pp. Single supplement is \$250 pp.

A deposit of \$100 pp is required by 11 March 2021 and the balance of \$1000 is to be paid by 29 April 2021.

If you have any dietary requirements let us know and we will give you a form to fill out. There may be a surcharge for special diets. For further information re this matter see Jim or Judy Thompson.

You will need to make your own rail reservations from Hornsby to Yamba and return. These can be made on the internet at transportnsw.info or at Central Station. You will need to have details of your concession cards available.

I suggest that you book your train seats as soon as possible. Jim and Judy are in seats 19 and 20 in car B which is in first class and in the same seats for the return trip. Our booking number is ULN349. If you are booking in person at Central or by phone and you quote our booking number they should be able to put you near us. If you book using the computer I think that you will not have any choice.
