

9.04 am train from Hornsby platform 3, arriving Central station 9.41 a.m. Catch the 9.52 am Light Rail L1 (Exit 1 Grand Concourse) to Pyrmont Bay, arriving 10.02. Short walk to Maritime Museum.

Each of these tours is about 1hr in duration. After the tour, you are free to explore the rest of the vessels and exhibitions at your own leisure. There are numerous places to have lunch at Darling Harbour or coffee/lunch at the Museum's Cafe.

HMAS Vampire is a tour onboard a navy destroyer. Access onto the vessel is conditional based on mobility. Pushers are not allowed on any of the vessels for safety reasons. Walking sticks are permitted, however, please note that there are steps and slopes that need to be navigated, so it might be difficult.

This Governor Macquarie & Francis Greenway site was once home to at least 5,000 convict women transported "beyond the seas". Hear the inspiring stories of the women's lives, learn about their survival, their legacy and much more.

Tour duration 1hr - 1.5 hrs. Closed-in walking shoes must be worn. There are a few places on the site where the ground is uneven, or you need to step over a gutter. Make sure if it is hot to bring water, hat and sunscreen.

Walk to Macquarie Street to catch Parramatta Light Rail – **Parramatta Square Station** alight at **Ngara Station**, then short walk to the Parramatta Female Factory.

Return trip to Hornsby – **Bus 600**. Bus stop directly outside Parramatta Leagues Club.

- Return to La Perouse for a guided tour of the La Perouse Museum. The museum is housed within the historic Cable Station building, once Australia's only link to the rest of the world. ## An Invitation to Probus members who have Hearing Loss.

My name is Chris Hunter, and I am a member of Berowra Mixed Probus Club. I have severe hearing loss, wear two hearing aids and I am heavily involved in advocating for people with hearing loss. I do this through my involvement in several hearing advocacy organisations that focus on improving services for people who are hard of hearing, such as Hearing Matters Australia, Deafness Forum Australia and the Hearing Hub at Macquarie University. I also give presentations on Hearing Loss Management to interest groups by invitation.

I know that there are several members of most Probus Clubs who either,

experience hearing loss but have not done anything about it but may like to know more.
experience hearing loss and wear hearing aids (and maybe a few who don't, but would
benefit from them) and/or
live with a person with hearing less

live with a person with hearing loss,

so, I would like to extend an invitation to them to join with some members from Berowra Mixed Probus at our monthly Hearing Ace Coffee & Chat group, to engage with others who experience/live with hearing loss and who understand the communication challenges it presents.

During 2024 I successfully ran a Hearing Ace Coffee and Chat group with several members of Berowra Mixed Probus. The general program was loosely based on the Active Communication Education (ACE) program which was originally developed by the University of Queensland (UQ) in 2001, and which has recently been revised. The overall focus of this approach is to assist those with hearing loss to better manage their hearing loss and to provide them with strategies for better hearing, listening, and communication in daily situations.

At our 'Hearing Ace' meetings we relate typical experiences of others in the group and share and learn from each other the communication tricks and tips we discover. We also reflect and at times laugh about some of the more challenging hearing situations we may have found ourselves in the past and identify what we could do differently next time. I've aimed to make these meetings lighthearted, where those attending feel they are in a non-threatening environment where they can share with others who 'get it'.

Probus members from local Clubs would be most welcome to join our sessions in 2025. We meet from 1:45pm til 4pm on the second Tuesday afternoon of each month in the front room of at the Berowra Community Health Centre, 123 Berowra Waters Road, Berowra.
