Please pay **EFT's** prior to monthly meetings including your name and outing abbreviation. Print and retain a copy of the bank receipt.






We will welcome Warren Henry

How do we maintain bonds of intimacy and togetherness when we live ever further apart?


That is, how do you pass on what's been important in your lifetime- the memories, keepsakes, ancestral stories and traditions that made your family what it is
